Synopsis

Local Kid is a heartfelt and humorous drama about dreams, friendship, and second chances, set in the lively streets of a working-class neighborhood.

Ercüment and Ali Nail are two former football players whose promising careers ended too soon. Now in their thirties, they spend their days hustling to survive selling fake perfumes and watches in backstreets where laughter hides regret.

Everything changes when they meet Zeyni, a 13 year old boy with torn sneakers, a battered football, and a spark of raw talent that rekindles their lost dreams. They nickname him Zizu, inspired by Zidane, and decide to guide him toward a better future one that might heal their own broken spirits along the way.

As they try to lead Zizu from dusty street matches to professional football, they face greedy managers, false promises, and the constant pressure of the neighborhood. But this journey becomes more than a dream of fame it's a story of redemption, loyalty, and the unbreakable bond between three souls united by love for the game.
